'Meet the Governors' – David Humphreys

Tell us a little bit about yourself:

I have had a 40-year career in independent education, teaching Geography at Bedford School and Welling-borough School before being appointed Deputy Head of Caterham School, Surrey, in 1991. We moved to Yorkshire in 1996 when I was appointed Headmaster of Woodhouse Grove School. In 2015 I was appointed Chief Executive of the Methodist Independent Schools Trust (MIST), retiring from that role in March 2023.

I have been married (to Alison) for over 40 years; we have four (now adult) children, all of whom will have competed against Moorlands when at Bronte House and some of whom still count former pupils of Moorlands among their friends today.

How long have you been involved at Moorlands?

I have known Moorlands pretty well since 1996 and was pleased to welcome a very good number of Moorlanders to become pupils of Woodhouse Grove over my 19 years as Head. Many of these pupils made a superb contribution to all-round school life, some became senior prefects, most went on to top universities (including Oxbridge) and all made their mark on the life of the Grove. In 2012, I encouraged the governors of Woodhouse Grove and trustees of MIST that Moorlands would be a great addition to the MIST group; that relationship has strengthened over the years so now Moorlands is a full member of MIST and thus fully able to leverage practical advice and support of one of the largest educational charities in the UK whilst retaining its own distinctive character

What do you love about our school?

Moorlands has always had a "buzz". I have always found the children to be caring, lively, inquisitive and supportive of each other. The staff work hard to bring the best out of the children and show huge commitment to the school. The facilities of the school are being further improved and being able to help plan this development will be enjoyable to be involved with.

What do you like to do when you're not busy being a Governor?

I like watching sport, especially cricket. I have become a member of Yorkshire CCC. I enjoy walking, bird-watching, genealogy and playing golf (which I play inconsistently, and the weather needs to be warm, dry and sunny – which means I don't play as often as I need to do to improve).

Have you got a secret talent or fun fact to share with us all?

As a former Head there must have been little room for secret talents or fun ... but I have enjoyed being a guest in the Royal Box at Wimbledon (twice), being the personal guest of Geoffrey Boycott at Headingley when he was President of YCCC, welcoming the great West Indian cricketer Sir Garfield Sobers to Woodhouse Grove for lunch, and joining the players and families of the Bradford Bulls in their post-match celebrations when they beat Leeds Rhinos at the Millenium Stadium in Cardiff in the Challenge Cup Final. You might not think these to be "fun facts", but I did say I enjoy sport --- so it was all fun for me!
