Dear Friends of Moorlands

This half-term marks an anniversary for me as it is seven years since I came to Moorlands as Headteacher . . . where has that time gone!!! Because of that, the current Year 6 cohort have always held a particularly special place in my heart. Many of them have been at Moorlands since nursery and Reception, so have been a constant during my time here. There are also a good number that were among the first families I showed around when I took up post and in Year 3, I had some time as one of their class teachers. It has been a real pleasure to watch them grow and develop into well-rounded, hardworking, fun loving Moorlanders!

We have been waiting for the final results to come in from their senior school entrance examinations and are incredibly proud of all of Year 6, who have been unanimously successful in being offered places at the schools they applied for: Woodhouse Grove, GSaL, Ashville College, Harrogate Ladies, Bradford Grammar, Wakefield Grammar, Gateways and St Peter's in York.

This in itself is fantastic (and now gives parents some difficult choices to make!) but there were also some notable individual results with fourteen scholarships being awarded to: Sophia -Grovian (WGS) and Music (GSaL); Edo - Headmaster's Award (WGS); Louis C - Charter Scholar (BGS); Charlotte - Grovian (WGS); Alyssa - Headmaster's and Music (WGS) and Music (GSaL); Sasha - Headmaster's (WGS); Orlaith - Head's Award music/academic combined (Ashville); Harriet - Music (HLC) and Music (Ashville); Will - Grovian (WGS) and Orla - Academic (Ashville).

These successes are a direct reflection of the breadth of experience and teaching the pupils receive as they go through school and to get a flavour of this do watch the video that Reception class have been busy making over the last few weeks. The film they have made is amazing, not just their presentation skills but the depth of knowledge that Reception have gathered through their 'Great Outdoors' topic. Life at Moorlands continues to be busy after half-term! On Wednesday 21st February, class group photos will be taken of all pupils from Squirrels to Year 6. After a number of years, we are having a change from Tempest photography and are trying a local company, Arts Photography Ltd, who are based in Roundhay.
